The <u>International Fellowship in Clinical Simulation at STRATUS</u> is a Boston-based, in-person fellowship designed for healthcare professionals outside the U.S. who possess the minimum of a bachelor's degree and are interested in gaining further exposure to medical simulation. Our program is typically completed over 12 months, but we also offer three and six month options.



Program Description

The International Program in Clinical Simulation is a comprehensive program that introduces the fellow to multiple facets of clinical simulation including, but not limited to, educational theory, debriefing, center operations, technology, course development, and research. The fellow will become an integral part of the STRATUS team.

Program Outcomes

- The Fellow will develop the cognitive and technical skills necessary to employ clinical simulation as a part of an undergraduate, graduate, and/or continuing education curriculum for physicians, nurses, and allied health professionals.
- The Fellow will acquire the skills necessary to design, develop and operationalize an interprofessional simulation center.
- The Fellow will acquire an understanding and facility to develop healthcare educational curricula incorporating clinical simulation.
- The Fellow will develop the skills to assess cognitive and technical learner competence employing validated metrics.
- The Fellow will develop the foundational skills necessary to conduct simulation-based research.

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
